ACTING SECRETARY KAISER:

House Bill 4826, an Act concerning regulation. 2nd Reading of the bill. No committee or Floor amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

3rd Reading. House Bill 4829, Guzmán. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

ACTING SECRETARY KAISER:

House Bill 4829, an Act concerning safety. 2nd Reading of the bill. No committee or Floor amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

3rd Reading. At the top of page 18, 5024,{sic} (House Bill) Lightford. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

ACTING SECRETARY KAISER:

House Bill 5024, an Act concerning local government. 2nd Reading of the bill. No committee or Floor amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

3rd Reading. The Senate will stand at ease for a few minutes to allow the Committee on Assignments to meet. The Members of the Committee on Assignments will come to the President's Anteroom, immediately. The Senate will stand at ease. (at ease) The Senate will come to order. Mr. Secretary, Committee Reports.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

We are now going to final action 3rd Readings, page 6, starting with 3114,{sic} (Senate Bill) Koehler. Senator Koehler seeks leave of the Body to return Senate Bill 3114 to the Order of 2nd Reading. Leave is granted. On the Order of 2nd Readings is Senate Bill 3114. Mr. Secretary, are there any Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

Floor Amendment No. 1, offered by Senator Koehler.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Koehler.

SENATOR KOEHLER:

Thank you, Madam President. I move to adopt the amendment, and I'll be happy... No, I'm sorry. This is Amendment No. 1. I'd like to withdraw that amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Are there any further Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

Floor Amendment No. 2, offered by Senator Koehler.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Koehler.

SENATOR KOEHLER:

Yes, I'd like to adopt this amendment, and I'll discuss it on 3rd.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? All those in favor will say Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it, and the amendment is adopted. Are

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there any further Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

No further amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

3rd Reading. Now on the Order of 3rd Reading, Senate Bill 3114, Senator Koehler. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

Senate Bill 3114, an Act concerning regulation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Koehler.

SENATOR KOEHLER:

Thank you, Madam President, Members of the Senate. The amendment becomes the bill. It primarily makes technical changes to the request of the Department of Insurance and Department of Healthcare and Family Services so that each Department can properly enforce the Act. And the notable -- changes include that changing physician to healthcare professional through the Act and defining healthcare professional accordingly. It shortens the length of time the healthcare professional has to submit a dispute relevant to the Department of 90 days instead of 180 days, ensuring that it has an automated -- automated process is used to identify claims and processing use specific coding guidelines in effect at the time of the service, removing provisions allowing the -- for batching of disputed claims, and adding that down coding does not include the practice of addressing instances where providers submit multiple codes for two or more services that must be included in one group, per federal and State requirements. This bill has been a long time in discussion. I will note something of

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kind of interest and importance here, is that there is language in this bill which talks about trying to circumvent the AI processes that are used and so we call for a human person to be involved in trying to resolve these disputes. I mean, I think that's kind of a new threshold for, legislations, that we have to identify a human person to be involved between the AI systems. But this is a process by which, physicians and -- and insurers or MCOs, can use to resolve disputes in terms of -- of -- of issues where downcoding may or may not be in effect. Downcoding, quite -- quite frankly, is -- is just an unfair system. There was some discussion about also trying to limit upcoding, but upcoding is primarily illegal. So, happy to answer any questions, and -- appreciate support.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? Senator Rezin.

SENATOR REZIN:

Thank you, Madam President. To the bill, please.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

To the bill.

SENATOR REZIN:

Thank you. First, I'd like to thank the sponsor for working with us and so many other groups and taking and incorporating our feedback. So, thank you for that, cause this really is an issue I didn't realize until I spoke to my local physician groups about what's happening. So, thank you for taking this on, Senator. The -- the final product is a pro-consumer bill that we all can be proud of. It will help protect patients from increased healthcare costs they were not expecting. As we know, each person's healthcare needs are very unique, and it takes a physician to be able to code after they've met with the patient, and that's why we need this

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legislation. We want to foster a healthcare system that's holistic, patient-centered, and preventative. And this -- this approach requires communication; it requires contacts and -- individualized treatment that can't or should not be replaced by a machine that's only purpose is to increase profits by making patients pay more or receive less. So, this is a very thoughtful bipartisan bill, and I ask for an Aye vote. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Are there any further discussions? Hearing none. The question is, shall Senate Bill 3114 pass. All those in favor will say Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 59 Ayes, 0 Nays, 0 voting Present. Senate Bill 3114, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. With the leave of the Body, please return to page 5, 2524,{sic} (Senate Bill) Lightford. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

Senate Bill 2524, an Act concerning transportation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Lightford.

SENATOR LIGHTFORD:

Thank you. Madam President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, this is an initiative of the ANSWER Incorporated, which is a organization in my district that works really hard with families who have children with developmental disabilities, and not only children, but older adults as well. We wanna make sure while they're driving, that law enforcement has a good indicator of if

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they have a disability when they're pulled over. So what we've done in this bill is we've asked the Secretary of State to indicate that an individual has an intellectual disability or autism spectrum disorder if they submit documentation with their driver's license. I'd be happy to answer questions. That's pretty much the gist of the bill. I ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussions? The question is, shall Senate Bill 2524 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 Ayes, 0 Nays, and 0 voting Present. Senate Bill 2524, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Turning to page 6, Senate Bill 3290, Joyce. Mr. -- Senator Joyce seeks leave of the Body to return Senate Bill 20 -- 3290 to the Order of 2nd Reading. Leave is granted. On the Order of 2nd Reading is Senate Bill 3290. Mr. Secretary, are there any Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

Floor Amendment No. 2, offered by Senator Joyce.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Joyce.

SENATOR JOYCE:

I'd like to adopt the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? All those in favor will -- will say Aye. Opposed, Nays. The Ayes have it, and the amendment is adopted. Are there any further Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

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Floor Amendment No. 3, offered by Senator Joyce.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Joyce.

SENATOR JOYCE:

Like to adopt the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? All those in favor vote, Aye. Opposed, Nays. The Ayes have it, and the amendment is adopted. Are there any further Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

No further amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

3rd Reading. Now on the Order of 3rd Reading. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

Senate Bill 3290, an Act concerning transportation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Joyce.

SENATOR JOYCE:

Thank you, Madam President. Senate Bill 3290, specifies that dealer providers are ineligible for funds from the Cycle Rider Safety Training Fund, and requires that a dealer provide offering cycle rider safety training courses shall adhere to the provisions under the corresponding subsection. This is a bill that was negotiated between IDOT, ABATE, and the Secretary of State, and we've got to -- come to an agreement on the bill. I'm happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

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Is there any discussion? Senator Lewis, what purpose do you rise? Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS:

Question. Thank you, Madam President. Question to the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

He indicates that he will rise.

SENATOR LEWIS:

Senator, thank you very much for -- for carrying this bill and -- and cleaning it up from last session. Quick question for legislative intent. Is the intent for IDOT to keep the application process open on a continuous basis, or will IDOT be able to close the application process as they see fit?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Joyce.

SENATOR JOYCE:

It's IDOT's intention to keep the application process open continuously.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS:

Thank you, and I encourage a Yes vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Any further discussions? The question is, shall Senate Bill 3290 pass. All those in favor vote, Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 Aye, 0 Nay, and 0 voting Present. Senate Bill 3290, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed.

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Senator Lewis, what purpose do you seek recognition?

SENATOR LEWIS:

Thank you, Madam President. I was absent on the Floor for Senate Bill 2524, and I wish to be noted as a Yes vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

It will be so noted, thank you. For further Floor action House Bill 3rd Readings, House Bill 4206, Martwick. He indicates that he -- Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4206, an Act concerning civil law. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Martwick.

SENATOR MARTWICK:

Thank you, Madam President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. House Bill 4206 creates the Charitable Organization Beneficiary Act, which sets forth an affidavit process for charitable organizations to receive or request information about property that they may be entitled to following a property owner's death. Basically what this bill does is it creates a series of laws and regulations around how property is disposed during the process of -- of probate through the -- the -- when people leave money to charitable organizations. And this is designed to ensure that the wishes of the person who has died and wished to leave portions of or the entirety of their estate or a gift to a charitable organization, that their wishes are met and it gets there in a timely purpose. I'd be happy to answer any questions. I'm -- I believe that all of the opposition has been moved to neutral, and I ask for an Aye vote.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, Senate -- shall -- shall House Bill 4206 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 Ayes, 1 -- 0 Nays, and 0 Present. House Bill 4206, having received -- having received the required constitutional amendment -- majority, is declared passed. House Bill 4247, Johnson. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4247, an Act concerning education. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON:

Thank you, Madam President. House Bill 4247, is an initiative of the Respiratory Health Association and the Christopher D. Redding Youth Asthma Foundation. It allows school districts to maintain an accessible supply of asthma medication as a -- at -- at -- at a practice field or gym, and expands the trained personnel who may administer asthma medication to a student to include coaches and athletic trainers. I know of no opposition, and I request an Aye vote. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, Senate --shall -- shall House Bill 4247 pass. All those in favor vote, Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 42 Ayes, 0 Nays and 0 -- 58 Ayes and 0, no, 0

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Nays and 0 voting Present. House Bill 4247, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 4421, Koehler. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4421, an Act concerning education. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Koehler.

SENATOR KOEHLER:

Yes. Thank you, Madam President, Members of the Senate. This amends the Illinois State University law repealing a provision regarding Illinois Institute for Entrepreneurial Education. This is a program that was transferred to another institution years ago, and it keeps turning up on the ISU audit. So, they'd like to just clear the record for once and for all. So, happy to answer any...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 4421 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 Ayes, 0 Nays, and 0 voting Present. House Bill 4421, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 4464, Morrison. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4464, an Act concerning regulation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Morrison.

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SENATOR MORRISON:

Thank you, Madam President. This amends the (Illinois) Insurance Code to make changes to dental coverage reimbursement law. Prohibits an insurer from requiring a provider to only accept payment from a credit card or electronic funds transfer. This bill has been negotiated. I am not aware of any opposition. I would appreciate an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 4464 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 55 Ayes, 0 voting Nay, 0 Nays -- 4 -- 0 voting Present. House Bill 4464, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 4541, Martwick. Mr. Secretary, read -- read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4541, an Act concerning civil law. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Martwick.

SENATOR MARTWICK:

Thank you, Madam President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. House Bill 4541 amends the Revised Uniform Unclaimed Property Act. Provides that the definition of property includes any overpayment made by a person to a unit of government or government agency, including but not limited to a payment for any tax, license, or fee that was made in excess of the amount required. This bill also provides that these changes are a

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restatement and clarification of existing law. Additionally, it exempts asset purchase agreements arising out of bankruptcy proceedings, corporate dissolution, or receivership, as well as an asset purchase agreement for a large business association. And -- oh, the Act requirement for finders, people who find unclaimed property, be licensed and their fees to be capped currently 10 percent of the amount recovered and collected. It requires asset purchasers to register with the Treasurer's Office and that is it. So, these are the annual update to the Revised Unclaimed Property Act. I know of no opposition, and I ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? Senator Tracy.

SENATOR TRACY:

Thank you, Madam President. I'd like to speak to the bill, please.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

To the bill.

SENATOR TRACY:

Yes, I support the bill, and I was just going to let the Body know that recent -- at a recent I-CASH event that Senator Harriss and I sponsored in Alton at the library, one person found out that he had \$94,000 in unclaimed property. So, that was quite a surprise, pleasant surprise for the person and so, it's -- it's a very good program, and I appreciate it. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Are there any further questions? Senator Plummer.

SENATOR PLUMMER:

Thank you. Question of the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

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He indicates that he will arise.

SENATOR PLUMMER:

Senator, this was -- was not a bill on my radar, but your -
- your comments... I just wanted to make sure I understood you
correctly. You said that, asset purchase agreements arising out of
Chapter 11 bankruptcy scenarios are not applicable to -- to this.
Is that correct?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Martwick.

SENATOR MARTWICK:

That is correct

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Plummer

SENATOR PLUMMER:

Just wanted to make sure I -- I understood that point
correctly. Other- otherwise, I -- I -- I think it's a great bill,
and look forward to supporting it. Thank you, Senator.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Seeing no further discussion. Senator Martwick, to close?

SENATOR MARTWICK:

Thank you for the brief discussion. I -- I wanna thank
Senator Tracy for that comment. I have been also blessed to have
that sort of situation happen, I think as many of us has had. And
so I -- I do wanna take a moment to compliment the Treasurer for
his dedication and work to constantly improving the administration
of unclaimed property. Just to -- to -- since Senator Tracy took
a moment, I had a senior citizen walk into a senior fair, and he
had been taken advantage of by a caregiver. He had literally had
his bank account cleaned out, and he was going to lose his home to

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a tax sale. He was, he -- he was destitute, and sat down at the I-CASH table and found \$120,000 life insurance policy that his wife had taken out and he was unaware of. And I was given the privilege of handing him that check two weeks later, and again, he was in pretty bad shape. He was advanced in age, but there was this... And I -- and I told a group of students this. They said, "What was your best day in the General Assembly?" And I said, "That was my best day," because I knew that that gentleman, who's a nice guy, he -- he was gonna live in his home, and he was not gonna have to choose between food and medicine. And so this program works, and I -- I appreciate the Body's continued support of reasonable, changes to it to make sure that it continues to function efficiently. Thank you, and ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

The question is, shall House Bill 4541 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 Ayes, 0 Nays, and 0 voting Present. House Bill 4541, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senator Cunningham, in the Chair.

PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR CUNNINGHAM)

Senator Collins, for what purpose do you seek recognition?

SENATOR COLLINS:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to be recorded for a Yes vote for House Bill 4464, please.

PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR CUNNINGHAM)

Thank you, the record will reflect your wishes. Next, Ladies and Gentlemen, we are going to move to House Bill 4560 from Senator

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Halpin. He indicates he wishes to proceed. Mr. Secretary, please read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4560, an Act concerning State government. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR CUNNINGHAM)

Senator Halpin.

SENATOR HALPIN:

Thank you, Mr. President. House Bill 4560 is another initiative of the Treasurer's Office, and again, is intended to be declarative of existing law, and it specifically authorizes the Treasurer to bring claims to recover State funds against banks and certain institutions for breach of presentment warranties. It also provides that the Treasurer -- the statute of limitations under the UCC does not apply when the Treasurer is bringing the -- the -- the action. There is some -- opposition from the Bankers Association, but it did pass the Judiciary Committee unanimously and passed the House overwhelmingly. You may deposit your questions with me, but I will answer them without interest.

PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR CUNNINGHAM)

Well played, Senator. Is there any discussion? Seeing none. The question is, shall House Bill 4560 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 57 Senators voting Yes, 1 voting No, 0 voting Present. House Bill 4560, having received the constitution required majority, is declared passed. Next, we will move to House Bill 4575 from Senator Holmes. She indicates she wishes to proceed. Mr. Secretary, please read the bill.

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SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4575, an Act concerning public employee benefits.
3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR CUNNINGHAM)

Senator Holmes.

SENATOR HOLMES:

Thank you so much, Mr. President. House Bill 4575 amends the Chicago Teachers Pension Fund Article of the Illinois Pension Code. By ensuring a single consistent pension petition deadline before October 1st of a given year for all board candidates. I know of no opposition. I would ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR CUNNINGHAM)

Is there any discussion? Seeing none. The question is, shall House Bill 4575 pass? All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 Senators voting Yes, 0 voting No, 0 voting Present. House Bill 4575, having received the constitutionally required majority, is declared passed. House Bill 4620, Senator Faraci. He indicates he wishes to proceed. Mr. Secretary, please read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4620, an Act concerning State government. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR CUNNINGHAM)

Senator Faraci.

SENATOR FARACI:

Thank you, Mr. President. House Bill 4620 requires the Department of Human Services to distribute educational materials

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about the (Senator) Scott Bennett ABLE program to individuals receiving or applying for DHS-funded disability services at enrollment and during eligibility reviews. I know of no opposition. I'd ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR CUNNINGHAM)

Is there any discussion? Seeing none. The question is, shall House Bill 4620 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 Senators voting Yes, 0 voting No, 0 voting Present. House Bill 4620, having received the constitutionally required majority, is declared passed. Senator Hunter back in the Chair.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

On page 9, House Bill 4747, Murphy. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4747, an Act concerning State government. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY:

Thank you, Madam Chairman. Ladies and Gentlemen, Senate Bill or House Bill 4747 simply changes the implementation date of the direct service -- "direct support service{sic} professional credential" pilot program, from FY'25 to FY'28. I know of no opposition, and I ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any -- any discussions? Seeing none. The question

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is, shall House Bill 4747 pass? All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. There are 57 voting Aye, 0 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 4747, (having) received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Next bill is 4749, Glowiak Hilton. Mr. Secretary, read the bill. Oh, House Bill 4754, Halpin. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4754, an Act concerning education. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Halpin.

SENATOR HALPIN:

Thank you, Madam President. House Bill 4754 is an initiative of IDFPR. It passed overwhelmingly without opposition, both in Committee and over on the House side. What it does is it adds two pieces of information to the report that student loan servicers - servicers are required to give to the Department. The first is the annual "default rate" for private student loans, and the other is the number of private student loans that originate with a co-sponsor. As I mentioned, there is no opposition, and I'd ask for your Yes vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 4754 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 Ayes, 0 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 4754,

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having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 4754. Opes, 4770, Koehler. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 4770, an Act concerning regulation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Koehler.

SENATOR KOEHLER:

Yes. Thank you, Madam President and Members of the Senate. This bill, makes some changes to the Illinois Credit Union Act, by stating that it is permissive, not mandatory, for the business office or of a credit union's registered agent to be in the same as the principal place of a business of the credit union. Makes other changes concerning the record of keeping of credit union board meetings, and furthermore, it authorizes credit unions to be debt cancellation products to be, to its members and expands on credit union's investment authority. I know of no opposition and ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any questions? Seeing none. The question is, shall House Bill 4770 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 Ayes, 0 voting Present, 0 -- 0 Nays, 0 voting Present. House Bill 4770, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 4896, Martwick. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

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House Bill 4896, an Act concerning civil law. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Martwick.

SENATOR MARTWICK:

Thank you, Madam President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. House Bill 4896 amends the Code of Civil Procedure, creating a process through which a person who acquired property through intestate succession and holds the interest in that land as a tenant in common, may seek to be adjudicated of the legal owner of the land. There's a -- a bunch of -- of criteria that the person must meet, not the least of which is being under 80 percent of the area's median income. So, this is a situation where intestate succession, grants ownership to a wide variety of people, and a one of the grantees or the recipients is holding the property, caring for the property, paying the tax on the property, and they have a way of using the courts to establish ownership of the property. I know of no opposition. Be happy to answer any questions, ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 4896 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 47 Ayes, 0 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 4890 -- 57 voting Aye, sorry, correction. House Bill 4896, having received the (required) constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 4977, Ellman. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

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House Bill 4977, an Act concerning regulation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Ellman.

SENATOR ELLMAN:

Thank you, Madam President. House Bill 4977, allows for and -- recognizes that new pathogens, emerging pathogens, may also be resistant to antibiotics. So this is the -- adds a definition of "pathogens of epidemiological concern" to the Hospital Licensing Act. It allows hospitals and the Department of Public Health to consider guidelines from additional organizations in addition to the CDC (U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) when developing interventions to prevent and control these newer "pathogens of epidemiological concern". I know of no opposition, and I request an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any questions? Any discussions? The question is, shall House Bill 4977 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 voting Aye, 0 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 4977, (having) received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 5047, Johnson. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5047, an Act concerning regulation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Johnson.

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SENATOR JOHNSON:

Thank you, Ms. -- Madam President. House Bill 5047, is an initiative of the Office of (the State) Long Term Care -- Ombudsman. And as it adds the Office of Long-Term Care -- Ombudsman to the list of entities, an owner of an assisted living facility, an MCDD facility, or an IDDD facility is required to send a notice of voluntary closure. And according to the office, this bill would allow residents to receive advocacy services related to the closure of these facilities and ensure their rights are being upheld. I know of no opposition, and I ask for an Aye vote. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any -- discussions? The question is, shall House Bill 40 -- 5047 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 57 voting Aye, 0 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 5047, (having) received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 5070, Ellman. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5070, an Act concerning safety. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Ellman.

SENATOR ELLMAN:

Thank you, Madam President. House Bill 5070 amends the Environmental Protection Act. It -- in provisions concerning the regulation of air pollution, water pollution, drinking water, hazardous waste and landfills, provides that the Pollution Control

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Board shall not adopt any standards that are less stringent than those existing in board regulations under identical and substance rulemaking. I request an Aye vote, and I'm here to answer any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 5070 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 47 voting Aye, 11 -- 45 voting Aye, 11 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 7040{sic}) (House Bill 5070), having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House - - House Bill 5081, Porfirio. Mr. Secretary. Oh, House Bill 5148, Morrison. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5148, an Act concerning criminal law. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Morrison.

SENATOR MORRISON:

Thank you, Madam President. This is an initiative of the Department of Human Services and requires prescribers to evaluate and document patient access to controlled substances using the PMP (Prescription Monitoring Program) when writing an initial prescription for Schedule II stimulant or any prescription for a Schedule II opioid or a Schedule IV benzodiazepine. Right now, in law, it is only required for a Schedule II narcotic like an opioid. Happy to answer questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

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Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 5148 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 voting Aye, 0 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 5148, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 5285, Belt. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5285, an Act concerning safety. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Belt.

SENATOR BELT:

Thank you, Madam President. House Bill 5285 amends the Radioactive Waste Storage Act to provide that interest earned by the investments or deposit of moneys accumulated in the Sheffield February 1982 Agreed Order Fund shall be deposited into the same fund for the continued maintenance of the Sheffield Low-Level Radioactive Waste Site and the surrounding buffer zone. It also changes the name of the Radioactive Waste Site Perpetual Care Fund to the (Sheffield) Low-Level Radioactive Waste Facility Operation Fund. Madam -- Madam President, I know of no opposition, and I ask for a favorable roll call.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussions? The question is, shall House Bill 5285 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 voting Aye, 0 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 5285,

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having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 5290, Ellman. Senate -- Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5290, an Act concerning regulation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Ellman.

SENATOR ELLMAN:

Thank you, Madam President. House Bill 5290 is a -- an initiative of IDFPR to modernize the Sales Finance Agency Act. It makes changes to several existing definitions, including special -- purpose vehicle, and provides that all moneys and expenses incurred shall -- be deposited into the Financial Institutions Fund. I know of no opposition. I request an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any question? Any discussion? The -- Senator Plummer.

SENATOR PLUMMER:

Thank you. Question of the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

And she indicates that she will rise.

SENATOR PLUMMER:

Senator, thanks for -- for bringing this legislation. We -- we're just trying to get a full accounting for which organizations the -- this would apply to.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Ellman.

SENATOR ELLMAN:

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Thank you for that question. It's not necessarily very clear. These are agencies that sell loans with -- based on retail installment contracts. Correct me if I'm wrong, -- I got that right.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Plummer.

SENATOR PLUMMER:

So my understanding is it -- it maybe wouldn't apply to a car dealership that's financing a car. It might apply to someone that's maybe buying a couch, or someone that's buying furniture, or someone that's buying consumer goods on -- on credit effectively?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Ellman.

SENATOR ELLMAN:

Thank you for that question. Yes, it does apply to automobile financing.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Plummer, any further questions?

SENATOR PLUMMER:

So fees -- fees are being increased here, but my understanding is in addition to the fees being increased, we're -- we're -- we're creating another fee to cover the cost of -- of the agency administering the program. So we -- we've got a fee increase, and then we've got the implementation of a new fee on the providers of this credit. Is -- is that correct?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Ellman.

SENATOR ELLMAN:

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One second, please. Thank you. We don't believe it creates a new fee.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Plummer, to the bill.

SENATOR PLUMMER:

Thank you. I -- I really appreciate the sponsor's, answer there, and I'm -- I'm -- I'm sure that -- that -- that's sincere. We -- we absolutely believe it does create a new fee in addition to the raising of the fees. So maybe we can talk about that later. I -- we don't have to get into a -- a back and forth on that, but -- but we're -- we're quite confident it does that. The concern here obviously is in an era of -- of increasing costs and affordability issues throughout the State of Illinois, this legislation directly increases the costs of borrowing on folks who, are probably most -- are in most need of credit, folks that are -- are going to acquire consumer goods on credit. And we just think, raising fees on folks in general is not a great thing, but when you're raising fees on people that need credit the most, which is the -- the providers of that -- that are impacted by this legislation, when you're increasing fees on -- on people that need credit the most, especially in an environment of -- of affordability issues throughout the State, that's -- that's not a good thing. So, appreciate the sponsor's sincerity and -- and efforts, but we just think raising fees, like this, on people who can least afford it is a bad thing. And we do also believe in addition to the raising of the fees, that this does also implement a -- a new fee on -- on these folks, as well. So appreciate the -- the sponsor's conversation here but I -- I do strongly urge a No vote.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any further discussion? Senator, please close.

SENATOR ELLMAN:

Thank you, and I appreciate those questions. Please note that, industry did not come out in opposition to this bill. This mainly is a consumer protection bill, and so much of IDFPR's regulation is to give the confidence in our consumers and in industry so that this -- these loans can be taken out with confidence. And I urge an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

The question is, shall House Bill 5290 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 36 voting Aye, 19 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 5290, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 5316, Porfirio. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5316, an Act concerning State government. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Porfirio.

SENATOR PORFIRIO:

Thank you, Madam Chair. House Bill 5316 amends the Nuclear Safety Law of 2004 to provide that the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security has the right to enter public and private property in order to take environmental samples in response to a disaster or incident that causes, or threaten to cause radioactive contamination consistent with U.S.

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Nuclear Regulatory Commission requirements.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 5316 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 44 voting Aye, 13 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 5316, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 5376, Belt. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5376, an Act concerning regulation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Belt.

SENATOR BELT:

Thank you, Madam President. House Bill 5376 makes a number of changes and updates the -- to the Illinois Mine Subsidence Insurance Fund regulatory framework. Most notably, it reaffirms the power of the Director of Department of Insurance to regulate the fund as a private insurer, as it currently is. Secondly, it clarifies that the fund's authority to -- the fund's authority to modify the maximum -- reinsured limits to the mine subsidence coverage with the Department of Insurance approval. And lastly, it requires insurers, to provide consumers a notice of mine subsidence insurance availability at each renewal. Madam -- I -- I know of no opposition, and I will yield for any questions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill

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5376 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 voting Aye, 0 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 5376, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senator Hastings, what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR HASTINGS:

Thank you, Madam President. Can I let the record reflect that I intended to vote Yes on House Bill 5047 -- 5047. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

It will be so noted, thank you. House Bill 5384, Walker. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5384, an Act concerning regulation. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Walker.

SENATOR WALKER:

Thank you. House Bill 5384 is identical to House -- to Senate Bill 3903 that came out of Committee. I would like to thank the staff of both Chambers for keeping up with some last-minute changes we made to it as a response to the Committee discussions. It does two things. It allows the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation to establish by rule, new fees. These are actually changed amounts of fees that have been in existence for many years, and it raises those fees. I know there's a resistance to increasing fees in general, but some of these fees have not been raised since Dwight Eisenhower was President, as great as he was, others not since LBJ (Lyndon B. Johnson). So I think it's about time to -- to

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allow -- these fees to reflect current costs. I know of no current opposition, and I would like an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 5384 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 38 voting Aye, 19 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 5384, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 5474, Johnson. Mr. Secretary, read the bill. Senator Johnson seeks leave of the Body to return House Bill 5474 to the Order of 2nd Reading. Leave is granted. On the Order of 2nd Reading, House Bill 5474. Mr. Secretary, are there any Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

Floor Amendment No. 1, offered by Senator Johnson.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON:

Thank you, Madam President. I would like to adopt the amendment and explain it on 3rd.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Any discussion? All those in favor will say Aye. Opposed, Nays. The Ayes have it, and the amendment is adopted. Are there any further Floor amendments approved for consideration?

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

No further amendments reported.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

3rd Reading. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

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SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5474, an Act concerning safety. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON:

Thank you again, Madam President. House Bill 5474 is an initiative of the Illinois Department of Natural Resources. It updates standards for lighting purchased with State funds, it increases the maximum light color temperature, clarifies exceptions to using up-lighting for historical facades, and mandates the extinguishing of said -- facades no later than midnight. And as -- as amended -- as amended, it simply corrects a technical discrepancy by adding the word "or" to the end of paragraph 11 of Section 20 of the Responsible Outdoor Lighting Control Act. And the rest of the bill, again, remains the same. I know of no opposition, and I request an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 5474 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 58 voting Aye, 0 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 5474, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. House Bill 5480, Anderson. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

House Bill 5480, an Act concerning safety. 3rd Reading of the bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

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Senator Anderson.

SENATOR ANDERSON:

Thank you, Madam President. This bill is pretty simple. It just updates statutory language, from the old national standard reporting system for fire departments from NFIRS (United States Fire Administration's National Emergency Response Information System) to the new system of -- of NIRS (National Fire Incident Reporting System). I know of no opposition, would ask for an Aye vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Bill 5480 pass. All those in favor will say Aye. Opposed, Nays. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 57 voting Aye, 1 voting Nay, 0 voting Present. House Bill 5480, having received the required constitutional majority, is declared passed. On page -- on page 21, Senate Resolutions. Senator Plummer, what purpose do you seek recognition? Okay. Senate Resolution 667, Senator Fine. Mr. Secretary, read the resolution.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

Senate Resolution 667, offered by Senator Fine.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Fine.

SENATOR FINE:

Thank you, Madam President. Senate Resolution 667, declares May 12th as MEA (Myalgic Encephalomyelitis) Awareness Day. This is something that we should all be aware of many times it's diagnosed as chronic fatigue syndrome, but it impacts about 25 percent of individuals who are -- who are falling under this category, and a

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number of them end up bedbound, many times for the result of their life. I was fortunate to learn about this from a constituent who came to my office and explained how her thriving son at the University of Chicago fell to ME, and her quest to make sure other families learn about this and don't have the experiences that their family did. So again, I'd like to educate the Body about ME and make sure that we have this on the forefront of future research. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall House Joint Resolution -- Senate Joint Resolution 6 -- 667 pass. All those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed, Nays. The Ayes have it, and the resolution is adopted. Senate Resolution 761, Edly-Allen. Edly-Allen, Senate Resolution 761. Mr. Secretary, read the resolution.

SECRETARY ANDERSON:

Senate Resolution 761, offered by Senator Edly-Allen.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Senator Edly-Allen.

SENATOR EDLY-ALLEN:

Thank you, Madam President. Senate Resolution 761, states that child -- Child Care Awareness{sic} (Aware®) of America for May 8th, 2026, that childcare has been and continues to be a lifeline for families and communities and the economy, and that childcare providers are essential to the health of our communities by fostering safe and welcoming spaces, supporting working families, and creating enriching environments where children develop lifelong skills. It hereby RESOLVES that we declare May 8th, 2026, as Provider Appreciation Day in the State of Illinois, and we urge all citizens to recognize child care providers for

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their important work and how valuable they are to our communities.
Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HUNTER)

Is there any discussion? The question is, shall Senate Resolution 761 pass. All those in favor will say Aye. Opposed, Nays. The Ayes have it, and the resolution is adopted.
